## 16. Importance I – from results to importance

Many GCSE students, asked to compare the importance of an event or development, will simply list its results, as though their importance is self-evident.

It is not: you have to list the results, and then explain why/how/whether they are important/unimportant.

## Adjectives of importance

Key phrases to use will be: "as a result...", "therefore...", "consequently...", "because of this..."

Particularly, two sentences you will be using a lot, are:

- THIS WAS [considerably, hugely, indispensably, particularly, profoundly, very] IMPORTANT BECAUSE...
- THIS WAS OF [inconsequential, lesser, limited, little, minor, slight, some] IMPORTANCE BECAUSE...
